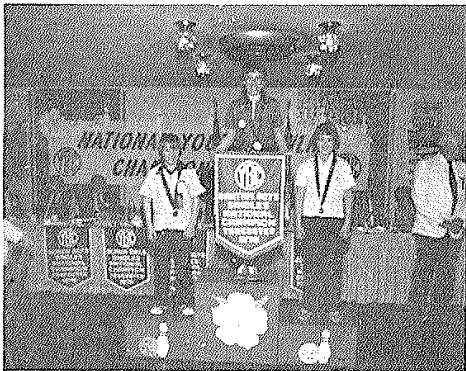

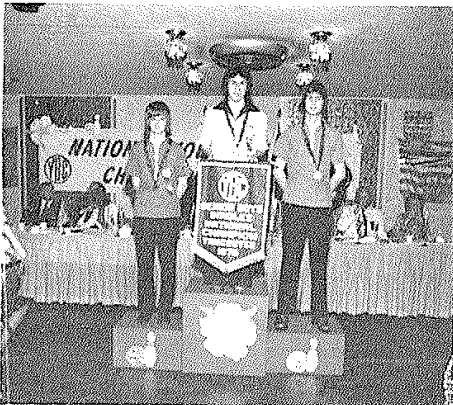

## Rosenbaum's Unprecedented 4 Gold Medals

When the Youth Bowling Council was founded some 15 years ago, it seemed hardly unlikely that any young bowler would win four national titles in his/her years of eligibility in the program. After all, with the number of elimination rounds held each year, it is quite a feat for a young bowler to just compete in four National Championships let alone conquer four gold medals.

David Rosenbaum attained this pinnacle of fame by capturing the Senior Boys 10-pin crown at the National Finals held in Vancouver, B.C. on April 1st and 2nd, 1978. David who hails from Estevan, Saskatchewan previously won national titles in the Junior Boys Singles 5-Pin Division in 1975, Junior Boys 10-Pin in 1976, and Senior Boys 10-Pin in 1977. Striving for his unprecedented 4th gold medal was not an easy task for David. Being the early favourite in the competition as well as the defending champion, produced quite a few added pressures not to mention the fact that human nature caused spectators to root for the underdogs. David wound up the 15 game rivalry with 10 wins and 5 losses and found himself in a tie for the gold medal with Gary MacDonald of Sault Ste. Marie, Northern Ontario. The mediocre scores in the tie-breaking game, before a pack-filled house, were evidence of the pressures which existed. David rolled 158 against Gary's 139. For the 4th time...David tasted the "thrill of victory"...He became the first bowler in Youth Bowling Council history to capture four gold medals in national competition and the only bowler to ever win a national title in both the 5-pin and 10-pin game.

David will be graduating from high school this year and plans to take an Arts and Science Course at the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon. Having reached his 18th birthday this past February winds up his career in the Y.B.C. 5-Pin program. However, due to the fact that the Y.B.C. 10-Pin division adopts the same age categories as our U.S. counterparts, the American Junior Bowling Congress, David still has some three years left in this division. Who knows ... David may well capture five or six gold medals before deciding to join the adult ranks.

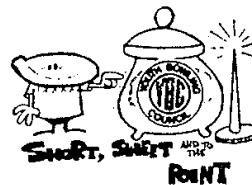

## Geared up for Thunder Bay

The best crowd ever is expected to attend the 1978 edition of the National Youth Bowling Council 5-Pin Championships. Transair had to put on extra flights to transport all the competitors and guests to Thunder Bay. Hotel accommodation for the adults now exceeds two hundred rooms and it is expected that close to 3,000 people will attend the Closing Ceremonies and Medal Presentations scheduled for Sunday, April 30th at the Fort William Gardens.

The host committee in Thunder Bay has been hard at work since last September securing billet homes for the competitors and making various other arrangements. They will reap the fruits of their untiring efforts on April 27th as 276 Provincial Champions representing 10 provinces and 1 territory converge on Thunder Bay. The actual competition will take place on April 28th, 29th and 30th with all singles competing at Superior Bowl, all girls teams at Galaxy Lanes and all boys teams at Playtime Lanes.

Competition should be keen as the 276 young bowlers take to the lanes to vie for the coveted gold, silver and bronze medals.

23 out of the 276 are former medal winners while 7 of them are past National Champions.

Valerie Hoppe of Thompson, Manitoba won the gold medal in the Bantam Girls Singles in 1975 while Chris Ahronson of Grandin Bowl, St. Albert, Alberta won the same event in 1974. Both girls will meet head on this year in the Senior Girls Singles division.

Manitoba's Senior Boys Team from Rossmere Lanes in Winnipeg should prove to be extremely tough. They racked up the highest team total of 3541 in provincial championships across the country. Team members Andy Stoddart and Tom McEachern won gold medals in the 1977 Senior Boys Team event while Kirby Morrison won his gold as a member of the 1972 Bantam Boys Championship Team.

Southern Ontario's Junior Girls Team from Markham Bowl in Markham scored 3214 at the provincial finals to lead the nation. Team members, Shirley Matus and Susan MacKenzie won gold medals in 1976 in the Bantam Girls Team Division and their prior experience in national competition will no doubt provide incentive to the

entire team in their quest for gold in 1978.
